## GRANT APPLICATION

The North Carolina Humanities Council offers grants up to \$500 for projects related to *Picturing America*, an initiative from the National Endowment for the Humanities that places a collection of reproductions of American art in schools, libraries, and other cultural organizations. The nation's artistic heritage – paintings, sculpture, architecture, fine crafts, and photography—offers unique insights into the character, ideals, and aspirations of this country. Projects that utilize *Picturing America* materials and themes by teachers, library, and cultural staff through interdisciplinary, humanities-based approaches are appropriate for this funding. Expenditures covered through this grant may include stipends for presenters, travel and lodging, publicity, and other materials.
